

## **COVID-19: LAR flies emergency doctor to Portugal**

A Luxembourg Air Rescue emergency doctor was flown out to Portugal on Sunday morning to help the country's hospitals cope with the dramatic health crisis, which has been provoked by the Covid-19 pandemic. The doctor is a specialist in anesthesia and resuscitation.

The operation was part of an LAR collaboration with the *Haut-Commissariat à la Protection nationale* (HCPN), the Ministry of State and the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs, as well as the Ministry of Health and comes just two days after Lisbon accepted Luxembourg's offer of aid in the common fight against COVID-19.

The LAR emergency physician was accompanied by a graduate nurse and teacher at the Lycée Technique pour Professions de Santé (LTPS) and this medical team has already started work in the Intensive Care Unit of the "Espírito Santo d'Évora" hospital in the Alentejo region.
